Communities Wildfire Protection Plan

CWPP Toolbox Training

What is a CWPP?

Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP) help communities prioritize wildfire risk reduction activities and access funds to carry them out.

Why are we updating now?

CWPPs have minimum requirements and must be approved by an authorized representative from CAL FIRE, the local fire department, and the local government. CWPPs in California must meet specific requirements to be considered valid plans by CAL FIRE. Requirements include:

- Documentation that the plan was collaboratively developed and included public engagement
- Assessment of wildfire hazard and risk
- Prioritized actions to address hazardous fuels and reduce structural ignitability
- Signed approval by authorized representatives from the local government, fire department, and CAL FIRE (Local CAL FIRE Unit Chief, Contract County Fire Chief, or their designee)
- Additional content to describe the planning area, plan goals and objectives, roles and responsibilities, response and suppression capabilities, and more
