The December meeting of the Plumas County Fire Safe Council will provide an opportunity to learn about local mapping capabilities. Amye Osti from 34 North will demonstrate the company's "collaborative natural resource management technologies and data solutions." She will be joined by Holly Jorgensen, Executive Director of the Sacramento River Watershed Program, to discuss how the use of this technology can inform hazardous fuels reduction planning. Additionally, local Geographic Information Systems expert, Kyle Felker, will provide an overview of the National Infrared Operations mapping that he facilitated for the Camp Fire.

The next Fire Safe Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 13th, 2018 from 9:00 am to 11:00 am at the Plumas County Planning & Building Services office, 555 Main Street in Quincy. Council meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month and are attended by citizens, business owners, and representatives from local, state, and federal government agencies, who share a common interest in preventing loss of life and minimizing loss of property from wildland fires.
