Plumas County Fire Safe Council Meeting 2/9/17

After cancelling January's meeting due to weather, the Plumas County Fire Safe Council has much to address at its upcoming meeting. As wet weather abounds, it may seem unusual that the Fire Safe Council sticks to its mission of minimizing risk due to wildfire. While climate change's effect on drought patterns is unknown, the current weather is a reminder that the time to support dynamic and resilient landscapes is now. And winter provides an excellent opportunity for planning. A top priority of the Council will be discussion of the new County-wide Community Chipping Program. They will also be setting goals for 2017, as well as considering potential projects for various funding opportunities.

The next meeting of the Plumas County Fire Safe Council on Thursday, February 9th, 2017 from 9:00 am to 11:00 am at the Plumas County Planning & Building Services office, 555 Main Street in Quincy. Council meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month and are attended by citizens, business owners, and representatives from local, state, and federal government agencies, who share a common interest in preventing loss of life and minimizing loss of property from wildland fires. Public input is welcome as the Fire Safe Council considers priorities for 2017 - please join us.
